Todd has been instrumental in assuring that the land and soil judging contests are held in Green County and the Southwest Area. He graciously agreed to be featured in a locally produced video that teaches kids and teachers about land judging in Wisconsin that has been watched 264 times. He has been engaged in the process of rulebook revisions and trialing new ideas. He is always happy to teach others about soils and their properties. The last two falls, he volunteered to fill in for a tech college soils class showing them recently dug soil pits. The Green County Land Judging Contest has had the tradition of holding the contest at a local farm and then everyone goes to the Moose Lodge in Monroe for awards and lunch. The contest was so popular this fall, that lunch couldn't be planned due to too many people for the building's occupancy.

Something unique to the Green County LWCD office is a weekly radio program on WEKZ that has been said to be the oldest continuous running program. Todd has done the lion's share of coming up with topics and recording it weekly for airing on local radio Monday mornings. The radio station used to provide cassette tapes that Todd would record his 3-5 minute educational blurb, updates and reminders on and then a station employee would physically pick them up from the office. The county has since updated to recording the programs on the computer and then emailing it to the station.
