 - 1. NRCS has been slow in the process to send it out, but it is in the right hands currently and should be sent out soon, hopefully.
 - ii. What did we learn from the process? [Tech Showcase: Kahoot]
 - 1. Kahoot
 - a. Stream, shoreline, and wetlands is the most needed category, including regionally. Farmstead, and cropland is second
 - b. Ecological literacy was the most common topic in community engagement, education, and enforcement
 - c. Team-building and conflict management was a priority for DNR staff with leadership skills
 - d. Lack of Availability is the most common barrier to participation. Discuss at the next meeting.
